Hanks' Gooney Corn Bread

- 1 Cup Cornmeal
- 3 Cups All-Purpose Flour
- 1 1/3 Cups White Sugar
- 2 Tablespoons Baking Powder
- 1 Teaspoon Salt
- 2/3 Cup Vegetable Oil
- 1/3 Cup Melted Butter
- 2 Tablespoons Honey
- 4 Eggs (Beaten)
- 2 1/2 Cups Whole Milk



1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F, and grease a 9x13 baking dish
2. Stir together the cornmeal, flour, sugar, baking powder, and salt in a mixing bowl.
3. Pour in the vegetable oil, melted butter, honey, beaten eggs, and milk, and stir just to moisten.
4. Pour the batter into the prepared baking dish and bake in the preheated oven for 45 minutes, or until the top of the cornbread starts to brown and show cracks.
5. Serve warm with butter! ENJOY!

Farm Safety Tips

- Discuss safety concerns with children and co-workers, explain safe handling and operating procedures.
- Store farm chemicals securely where kids and animals can't access them. Also make a list of chemicals for firefighters in the event of a fire on the property.
- Prohibit riders on tractor fenders, hitches, attachments, or implements.
- Conduct regular equipment inspections, as this act can prevent farm-related injuries by identifying problems and hazards early.
- Outfit tractors and farm trucks with fire extinguishers and first aid kits.
- Ensure all headlights, flashing warning lights and turn signals are in good working order.
- Have a Slow Moving Vehicle (SMV) emblem on your equipment.
- Be prepared and expect the unexpected when traveling to your next farm!

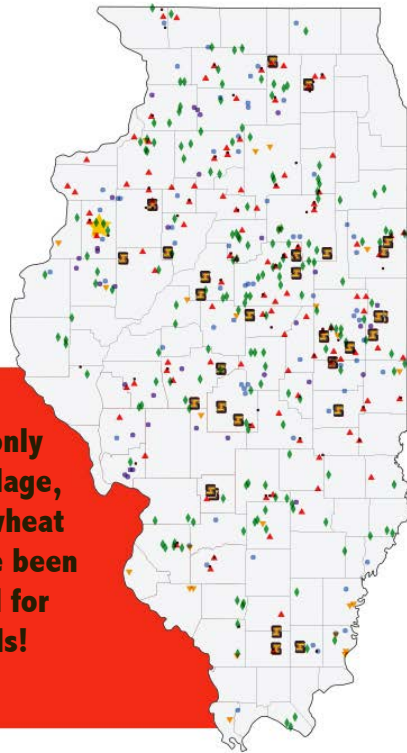

Tips for Getting Your Planter Ready to Go

Below are some general manufacturer's tips for checking a planter.

- Unit should be cleaned, inside and out.
- Seed meters or seed drop tubes should be free from anything that interferes with their operation.
- Worn parts should be replaced.
- Worn disc openers should be adjusted or replaced.
- Coulters and disc openers should be aligned.
- Worn seals or drums or vacuum discs should be replaced.
- Finger pick-up back plates should be checked for rust, residue, and worn-down dimples.
- Seed tube should be cleaned and replaced if excessively worn at the bottom.
- Monitor sensors should be cleaned.
- Seed conveyor belt should be checked for brittleness and replaced if needed.
- Chains should be lubricated and replaced if worn excessively.
- Tires should be checked for proper inflation and significant wear.

Always refer to the manufacturer's manual before performing any maintenance.

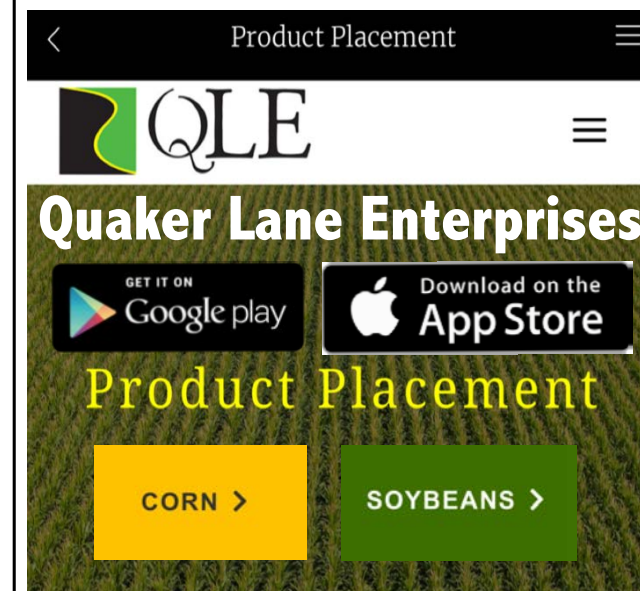
